## ABOUT MUSTARD

Mustard is an organisation that exists to transform lives through Jesus in schools. We do this through our Student Movement consisting of student-led Lunchtime Groups, and our school seminar and chapel programs that are aimed at exploring faith and life in big group presentations.

### Mustard Student Movement

The Mustard Student Movement is a movement of young people committed to living out their faith at school. The primary expression of the Student Movement is through Lunchtime Groups, where communities of Christian students gather together weekly, explore ideas of faith and life, and encourage one another to live it out in action. Mustard recruit student leaders to run these lunchtime groups and then empower, equip and encourage them to be leaders for Jesus in their schools.

### Schools Seminar & Chapel Programs

Mustard's Schools Programs are big group presentations which may be in the form of a chapel service, a program that is integrated into a faith week or an extended presentation with discussion. We take the cultural norms young people face today – from mental health to social media to identity and present them with a Christian world view. The goal is to involve the lunchtime group from the school or other Christians so that students have a Christian connection in the school after the program is over.

## ABOUT THE POSITION

As a South Australian Team Leader, your role is to build Mustard's ministry in the State of South Australia. This involves working alongside the South Australian Student Movement Co-Ordinator in recruiting students to start up Lunchtime Groups in schools, and supporting leaders of groups via networking opportunities, mentoring and training. The role also includes pursuing local ministry partnerships and church connections, promoting and leading School Programs in local schools and recruiting prayer and financial supporters.

## KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Under the guidance of the Mustard CEO, the SA Team Leader will work alongside other SA staff to:

### Grow

- Engage with youth and adults at external events, including youth events, camps, and conferences with the aim of promoting the work of Mustard.
- Assist with recruitment, training and resourcing of Student Leaders.
- Assist in maintaining and extending an online presence through Instagram and Facebook.
- Co-Lead and develop Student Movement Leader training opportunities and events.
- Connect with local Christian organisations and churches to build financial and prayer support.
- Develop and expand opportunities to present seminars and at chapels.

### Support

- Manage and participate in the support given to Student Leaders, including communicating with leaders, visiting groups, coaching leaders, referring resources, and facilitating networking opportunities.
- Assist in the production and distribution of the termly Supporter Prayer Letter
- Assist with pastoral care, mentoring, training, and support of Student Movement Leaders
- Partner with local churches to provide prayer and support to Student Movement Lunchtime Groups, including encouraging commissioning of new student leaders
- Assist in planning, organising and leading Mustard SA events, including Not Ashamed Workshop, Walk the Way, and the mid-year Supporters Dinner.

### KEY SELECTION CRITERIA

- Passion for following Jesus and seeing the growth of His Kingdom, especially in schools.
- Alignment to the ministry vision, mission, and strategy of the Mustard Student Movement.
- Mature understanding of the Bible and Christian faith (theological training an advantage)
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills with youth and adults
- Leadership experience (ideally with training and mentoring skills)
- Public speaking ability to both adult and teenager audiences
- An understanding of the context of religion in SA schools and the current issues facing young people.
- Self-motivated, organised and a team player.

### Desired Skills

- Basic graphic design skills including creating social media posts
- Event management experience
